*This is a preliminary estimate, as stipend levels for academic year 2022-23 are still being finalized. Your actual stipend will be no less than this amount.

The **dissertation completion year fellowship becomes available as soon as you are prepared to finish your dissertation, ordinarily in the fifth or sixth year.

Understanding Your Financial Aid Award

Award Terms and Conditions

Eligibility for financial aid is contingent upon continued confirmation by the faculty that the student is making <u>satisfactory progress</u> toward the degree.

Students are expected to register continuously for full-time study each term. Any deviations from this enrollment pattern should be discussed in advance with a financial aid officer, as interruption of study may result in award modification or termination.

A detailed discussion of <u>GSAS financial aid policies</u> is available on the GSAS website; students should also consult their academic programs to determine whether other program-specific rules apply.

Tuition

<u>Tuition and required health fees</u> are charged to the student account in July for the fall term and December for the spring term. Unless noted otherwise above, fellowships for tuition and health insurance fees are applied directly to the student account in equal installments each semester.

Health Fees

GSAS fellowship awards cover the required student health fees assessed for the <u>Harvard University Health Services</u> and the <u>Harvard University Student Health Insurance Plan</u>. Students who waive this coverage will have their awards adjusted accordingly; fellowship support is not available to cover the cost of insurance from other sources.

Academic Year Stipend/Summer Research Award

The first stipend check will be made available at the start of the fall term. Subsequent monthly stipends are disbursed to students on or around the first day of each month. <u>Additional information</u> is available on the GSAS website.

Teaching Fellowship

Your financial support includes several semesters of teaching and/or a comparable paid activity. This component of your funding is provided by your academic program and is contingent upon the successful completion of your program's General Examination requirement and the satisfying of any program prerequisites for teaching eligibility.

Outside Awards

GSAS students are strongly encouraged to apply for appropriate Harvard and outside fellowships throughout their enrollment. All students who receive funds from an outside source are expected to accept the award in place of the above Harvard award. In such cases, students may be eligible to receive a GSAS award of up to \$4,000 for each academic year of external funding secured or defer up to one year of GSAS stipend support. <u>Additional information</u> is available on the GSAS website.

Other Sources of Support

Other financial support available to you as a GSAS student include teaching and research assistant positions in the 5th year (subject to availability) and <u>travel and research fellowship</u> competitions.

US Income Taxes

In general, funds received to pay for tuition, fees required for enrollment, or course-related fees, books, supplies, and equipment are not taxable. Any additional funding, such as living expense and travel stipends or funds received as payment for providing teaching, research, or other services, may be subject to US federal income tax.
